Founded in 2001, CSAT began as a K-6 Elementary School with 700 students. Today, we serve over 2,300 students in grades K-12 with a mission of preparing students to attain family sustaining careers by integrating career exploration and **lifelong learning culture.** Free to attend and open to all residents, CSAT serves a diverse student body representing 19 different school districts throughout Western New York, with approximately 84% of our students residing within the city of Buffalo. Our High School has a 97% graduation rate over the past 12 years. CSAT has developed Early College and Career Pathways (ECCP) in order to offer college-level coursework to students in conjunction with extensive career exploration. The goal of ECCP is to ensure that students are prepared for a range of high demand family-sustaining careers upon graduation. Dual enrollment courses offered through our partners at SUNY Buffalo State College and SUNY Erie give students the opportunity to gain both high school and college credit simultaneously. ### **CREDITS TO CAREERS**

A key feature of ECCP is the flexibility it offers. Students will be prepared to leave CSAT and directly enter the work force following internship and high school graduation, or attend a two or four-year college. In each scenario, students will have accumulated transferable college credits toward their desired career goals, having "stackable options" to attain a professional certificate, associate's or bachelor's degree. At CSAT, career readiness is the culmination of foundational skills and workbased learning experiences that result in an immediately employable student upon graduation.

### **OUR PARTNERS**

Our partnership with SUNY Buffalo State College and SUNY Erie is an important component of the ECCP. Many CSAT graduates attend these local institutions to earn a certificate, associate's or bachelor's degree in their chosen Pathway. Dual enrollment courses allow students to earn stackable and transferable college credits while they are still in high school, and students can also step onto campus at SUNY Buffalo State or SUNY Erie (North, South, or City) during their senior year to experience college coursework and college life first-hand.

### **SUMMER BRIDGE**

Summer Bridge on the SUNY Buffalo State Campus is a critical aspect of ECCP. It provides early exposure to college coursework, a college campus, and career exploration. This opportunity allows students to earn three college credits while receiving support by developing targeted study skills and the academic confidence to ensure a successful transition into college.
